The Summer 2023 <u>Community-Academic Scholar</u> application period is now open. There are opportunities that may be of interest to undergraduate students who are passionate about working toward solutions to many of the challenges facing our local and regional communities: mental and physical health, poverty, health disparities, and our society's urgent need for racial and social justice. <u>Previous scholars</u> have spoken about gaining a deeper connection to the local community, connecting with other students, and the personal and professional growth they have experienced as part of the Community-Academic Scholars Program.

ILLINOIS LEADERSHIP CENTER

The Illinois Leadership Center currently has registration open for 3 of their impactful i-Programs that I would encourage you to share with your students!

Blended Ignite- *Registration extended to Feb 1* The Ignite program focuses on skills necessary for effective group and organization development. Students who participate can expect to develop approaches to leading change initiatives, learn about systems thinking, and coalition building. At Ignite, students will work with other students to develop a plan for their own change initiative. There is an online component students must complete by February 3rd. Students will then attend a 3 hour session at the Illini Union ABC rooms on Saturday, February 11th from 9 am to 12 pm.

In-Person Imprint- The Illinois Leadership Center will be hosting our Imprint i-Program on Saturday, February 25th from 10 am to 4 pm. The Imprint program focuses on competencies necessary for displaying leadership during times of personal and professional transition. Students develop skills in managing themselves during times of change; and learn how to develop, and maintain, the personal and professional networks necessary to sustain success in any environment. The program is open for all students. Registration is open now and will close on February 13th. Students will have an opportunity to connect with alumni in their field to learn all about their transitions into the professional world.

Blended Inclusion- The Inclusion program focuses on concepts such as equity, equality, diversity, inclusion, and privilege. Students who participate will recognize the values of others and identify differing social identities in relation to leadership. Inclusion will have an online component, with modules due by February 24th and an inperson component on March 4th from 9 am to 12 pm in the Illini Union ABC rooms. Registration for Inclusion closes on February 20th.
