Eligibility Requirements

Departmental distinction: The department may award distinction, high distinction, or highest distinction to any Anthropology major whose overall and major grade point averages are 3.25 or higher; and who successfully completes 33 hours of anthropology courses, including 4-6 hours of <u>ANTH 494</u> and <u>ANTH 495</u> resulting in an Honors Thesis. The level of distinction is based on evaluation of the honors thesis.

After working under the close direction of an anthropology faculty member for 2 semesters, the quality of the thesis is assessed by how the work offers a thoughtful argument, is well formatted, written and well organized, and engages with relevant anthropological literature. Each student is then certified for graduation with "Distinction," "High Distinction," or Highest Distinction."
